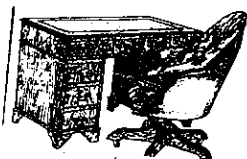

## KITCHEN CAPERS

— **BON APPETIT** —

### Cheese Meringue Pie

Flan case 6 oz. flour, pinch salt, 3 oz. margarine or lard, approx.  
3 dessertspoons cold water

Filling 1 oz. butter or margarine, 1 oz. flour,  $\frac{1}{2}$  pt. milk, 6 oz. grated cheddar cheese, 2 egg yolks, salt, pepper and a little cayenne pepper (according to taste)

Topping 2 egg whites, pinch salt, 1 oz. grated cheddar cheese

### Method

Line 7 - 8" flan case with pastry and bake in hot oven ( $400^{\circ}$ ) for 20 minutes. To make filling - melt fat in saucepan, blend in flour and cook for minute or two. Remove from heat and add milk gradually, stirring all the time. Return to heat and bring to boil, stirring. Add grated cheese, egg yolks and seasoning to taste. Pour into prepared and baked case. To make topping - whisk egg whites and salt until stiff. Cover cheese filling with roughed up whites and sprinkle with grated cheese. Bake in moderate oven ( $390^{\circ}$ ) for about 10 - 15 minutes. Serve hot or cold.
