The Nativity Play, performed by our school children, was once again excellent - the skill of parents, teachers and helpers in presenting, dressing and encouraging the children made this event outstanding.

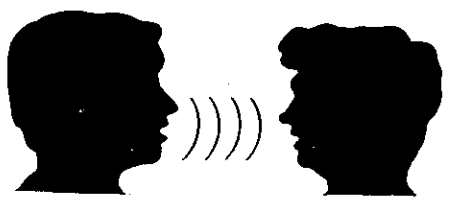
THE CHILDREN THEMSELVES WERE SUPER!
