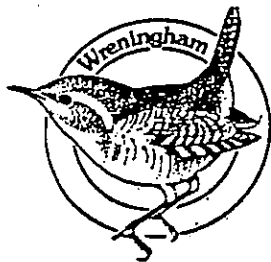

All at 7.30 p.m., £2.00 per person. Come and try it.

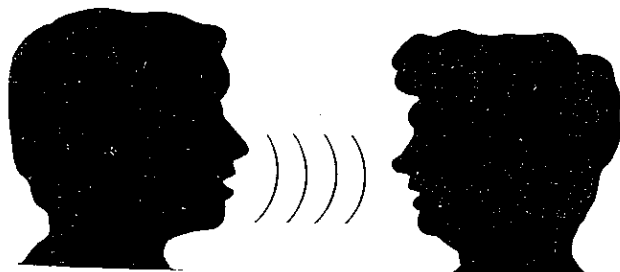
We are on the lookout for a site for this years bonfire on November 5th. - We will find one, we always do! Look out for posters or details from the Club nearer the time.
