WHO WAS BILL WELLS?

William Sandford Wells who died on 8th November had until recently lived in Wreningham for about 50 years, along with Mary his wife who died in July of this year.

To many people in the village he will be known as their former employer as over the years Bill employed a large number of local people in his business both at Long Acre and Ayton Road, Wymondham. One of the first things I remember him doing was making gear knobs for Lotus cars and over the years the work expanded to take in all manner of timber craft.

Bill served on the Parish Council for a number of years and was for a time Parish Council Chairman. He served on the village hall committee at the time of the building of the present hall and was practical in his involvement with the building. The design and quality of the stage front and timber work round the kitchen area, which at the time was the bar, was all down to Bill's work. Maybe you remember the fund raising events held at Long Acre? — the BBQ which ended up as a late night free for all in the swimming pool. Others of you will have been extremely good long term friends of Bill and Mary. However you remember him, Bill played an important role in this village one way or another and there will be many people in Wreningham who will be thankful that he and his family chose to settle here and sad that he is no longer with us.


