WRENINGHAM FUEL TRUST

The Trust Deed sets out that "The income from Wreningham Fuel Trust has to be given to provide fuel for the poor persons of the parish of Wreningham". This means that the charity income is available to anybody in the parish who is in need and the application may be made by the needy person or anybody who wishes to nominate a person to receive help towards their fuel bills. It is a requirement of the Trust Deed that all the money received in a year is paid out in the same year. Traditionally, in the event of few applicants, the Trust invites persons over 70 years to apply to the trustees for consideration.

Applications / nominations are invited for a distribution to take place in January. 
