

The defibrillator training in June went well, and for those attending, the two hours flashed by. A short description of the sessions is on the website. However, without the training you can still use the defibrillator since it tells you precisely what to do and will not operate unless safe to do so. The defibrillator is housed in a bright yellow cylindrical box on the East wall of the Hall.

At last the grant for improving the Broadband service at the hall has been received. We will pass it on to the hall management team in order for them to arrange for the BT infinity 2 service, buy the equipment and install it ready for your use. It is expected to be operational by the end of July. Further news will be available on the website in due course.

The development on Church Road is very near completion. Some houses are now occupied and we welcome our new neighbours and villagers. There are some concerns about the roadside verge and the pathway (trod). I have spoken to both the builders and NCC Higways. The area Highways Engineer accompanied me to examine the site to identify a solution and prevent a permanent problem for residents.

The £13,000 Community Infrastructure Levy will be discussed at our next few meetings, so that we can assign it to projects which help our community. It is still not too late for you to submit ideas to the Clerk, for us to consider.

In response to requests to find ways to slow traffic in the village (besides the electronic speed sign) we have acquired a number of wheelie-bin stickers. These ask people to slow down. (continued on next page) (from page 3)

Each household within the 30 mph area will receive 2 stickers. Please affix them to the side of the bin without covering the SNC logo. If you want more stickers please ask the Clerk.

From Monday 24th July, and every 4 weeks thereafter, the Mobile library will be stopping at the Village Hall instead of the Old Post Office in Top Row. A list of dates is given elsewhere in this Mardle. Villagers had said that it would be good to have it back in the centre of the village. Please make use of it.

You may have seen that some of our trees are tagged or marked with red paint. NCC are surveying all the roadside trees in Norfolk to establish the extent and potential impact of Ash-die back. This, along with other arborial matters, needs the attention of a Tree Warden for the village. I hope that someone will volunteer for this role.

Our next meeting is on the 12th September. As ever we will post the agenda on the noticeboards and the website several days before the meeting . You are welcome to attend and help us in working for the village. We do have a vacancy for one councillor, if you'd like to play an active part in the lowest, but significant, tier of local government.


