So here we are at the beginning of a brand New Year and I hope it will be a healthy and happy 2017 for us all.

Many of you will know, there are significant changes ahead for the running of Wreningham Village Hall, as the Social Club Committee and the Village Hall Management Committee merge to form a single managing group.

I feel that this will be an important and necessary step forward and will ensure that, in the future, all decision making is open, inclusive and democratic.

It is proposed that the new Committee will comprise a maximum of 9 members. Should more parishioners wish to join, then a vote will be taken at the AGM.

The AGM will be held on Sunday 5th February at 4pm in the Hall. There will be an end of year report from the outgoing Committee's Chair and Treasurer. The new Committee will then be formed from the villagers present at the AGM.

This is a significant change and we would appreciate the support of as many of you as possible. You will all be made very welcome.



Village Hall

A quick look at the on-line calendar for Hall bookings shows how busy the Hall can be with Zumba, Line Dancing, Rock & Roll, private hirings, theatricals, the school, the monthly coffee morning and other events. On Thursday and Friday evenings from 8pm, the Social Club provides a bright and lively reception for all-comers.

The recent survey regarding the Hall underlined that it could offer accommodation for additional uses and cater for new and different groups and interests. The AGM will provide the stepping stone for a newly formed committee to consider how new Hall users could be encouraged to exploit the gaps in the diary.

On-going maintenance has seen Maurice Green arrange for the removal of the dead tree at the Eastern end of the car park; in the February half-term the tree surgeons will undertake work on the other trees around the grounds; the fire extinguishers have all been checked out; the bottle banks emptied.

The heaters in the Margaret Preston Room and the air conditioning in the main Hall have been operating for a while now. We would appreciate your feedback on their effectiveness.

"Wreningham Ware" from 8th/9th century has been uncovered on Church Road and is described and pictured in the archaeological report posted on the village website. The report confirms just what a long history this village has, with possible evidence of (continuous) occupation stretching across Saxon, Medieval and Roman eras right to the present day.

The defibrillator is to be fixed to the Village Hall wall soon. We will be posting notices about training in the use of the defibrillator in the next few weeks. We'd be pleased to see as many as possible trained in its use.

The Telephone box on Ashwellthorpe Road is soon to be adopted by the Parish and Cllr. Morris has received a number of suggestions on its future use. A recent one, given the finds on Church Road, is for a mini-museum!

Will landowners with hedges alongside roads and pathways please ensure that they are properly cut? Parishioners have commented that some hedges are overgrown and impeding the safe passage of pedestrians, cyclists and drivers.

David Kirk and I delivered a short survey about Broadband use and experience to the village "outliers" on the Broadband supply. We hope this data will help when we discuss with our councillors from South Norfolk and Norfolk Councils a potential solution to the problem of parishioners being unable to access higher Broadband speeds. Broadband in Wreningham

We have known for a while that there are residents within the village who are unable to access the Superfast Broadband that the majority can access via their service providers. This issue has been raised in Parish Council meetings, with Better Broadband for Norfolk (BBfN), County & District Councillors and our MP. In mid-January, in preparation for a meeting to identify a practical approach to alleviate this situation, we decided to survey the "outliers". Some 40 households received a survey to record their experience. This has been processed and the outline results are presented below.

The outcome of this meeting (with SNC & NCC) will be reported at the next Parish Council meeting. More information and background is planned to appear on the village website.
