Coverage extends at least to the boundary of the Village Hall plot.

We say Goodbye and Good Luck to Ian and Jo Dobson who have left for Lincolnshire after 39 years in Wreningham. Ian was twice Chairman of the Village Hall Committee as well as doing several projects over the years.

At 4pm on the 5th November, the Village Hall AGM is being held. The Chair and Treasurer will report on the past year and then elections take place for the next year's committee. All Wreningham parishioners who are 18 or over are welcome to attend and vote.

Anglian Water have started their work to upgrade the water mains in the village. It will take some 6 months before they finish. If there are issues with the work, beyond what you might expect, please contact the Clerk. When we have the site manager's contact details they will be posted on the website.

I need to highlight the request from the last Mardle regarding obstructions to the highways or footpaths. Please ensure that you keep your hedges and/or trees suitably trimmed so that they do not cause any interference to road users or footpath users.

Do come to the Coffee Morning on Wednesday 27th September at the Village Hall - it's part of the Big Coffee Morning for Macmillan Nurses - and bring CAKE, or, be ready to eat cake!

We discussed the spending of the Community Infrastructure Levy, currently £13,700. There have been a number of suggestions, including a village SAM2 speed sign, a new noticeboard for the Church, an archeological project and improvements to the Hall. Wreningham All Saints Church

Rev. Suzanne Cooke left the Benefice at the beginning of July. The Bishop has now confirmed that the Norwich Diocese will provide us with a full time clergy, living at the rectory in Tacolneston. As well as carrying out the normal duties within the parishes, they will work with the 4 church schools and the local community at large as time will allow.

The "job specification" is prepared and gives details of the Benefice, house available, etc. as well as the demands of the job. Once the Bishop approves, we will advertise. Subject to applicants and the notice they will have to give, the earliest we are likely to have a new minister is about Easter 2018. More realistically we could be waiting much longer than that.

In the meantime, there will be a Service of Remembrance on Sunday 12th November at 10.30 am at Wreningham church when the names of those on Wreningham and Ashwellthorpe war memorials will be read out.

Wreningham Fuel Trust

The Trust Deed sets out that "The income from Wreningham Fuel Trust has to be given to provide fuel for the poor persons of the parish of Wreningham". This means that the charity income is available to anybody in the parish who is in need and the application may be made by the person themselves or anyone wishing to nominate a person to receive help towards their fuel bills. It is a requirement of the Trust Deed that all the money received in a year is paid out in the same year. Traditionally, in the event of few applicants, the Trust invites persons over 70 years to apply to the fund for consideration.

We are now inviting applications for a distribution to take place in January.

Basil Day

Many readers will have had contact with Mr Basil Day of Beetly, the author of the book "Past Days in Wreningham" first published in 1997. On his retirement he researched his family history and discovered that at least 5 generations had lived and worked in this parish. This prompted him to research many other families in Wreningham. Working with them, he produced a wealth of historical information and wrote it up in his book which is now used by others tracing family ancestry. He donated the profits from the book sales to the Wreningham All Saints. These are estimated to be £1500 todate. Mr Day recently died and was buried on 19th September in Wreningham graveyard alongside many of his past family members. 
