Wreningham Parish Council Minutes of the extraordinary meeting of the Parish Council held in the Margaret Preston Room, Wreningham Village Hall on Tuesday 28 June 2016 at 7.30pm.

785 To consider apologies for absence - Apologies were received and accepted from Cllrs. Gauthier and Hardy.

786 To receive declarations of interest - None

787 Open Forum - no reports or comments

788 To discuss issues relation to the SAM2 machine, including:

- Locations
- Delays in obtaining the machine from the previous parish
- Data analysis
- Adoption of a management policy and risk assessment

Cllr Dalmazzo voiced his frustration that the SAM2 could not be placed in the most needed and the most effective locations in the village. Following discussion, it was agreed that Cllr Dalmazzo will provide the clerk with revised location points and the benefit of siting there. The clerk will contact Highways to ask for approval for these sitings.

The SAM2 machine was handed over from Tacolneston Parish Council after 4 days delay in November 2015 and a 9 day delay in May 2016 Thus, Wreningham was unable to deploy it for the scheduled month on either occasion. Heidi Frary, as manager of the rota for the SAM2 is amending the village sequence on the rota. Henceforth, Wreningham will receive the SAM2 from Ovington (starting in October 2016), rather than from Tacolneston.

Data analysis is difficult given problems with downloading it, its format and its base date for recording. It was agreed that the clerk would arrange for Cllrs Hill and Dalmazzo to meet with the relevant staff member at Westcotec, in order to receive comprehensive instructions relating to the programme and the data (specifically initial state, download and analysis). It was also agreed for the clerk to contact Westcotec to ask about any other signs or flashing sign which may help to address the speeding issue within the 50mph section on the B1113. It was noted with some disappointment that Norfolk County Council have ruled out a reduction to the speed limit in this area, for the forseeable future, due to funding cuts. Councillors asked the clerk to find out the legal ramifications of a parish opting to reduce a speed limit and replace the traffic signs accordingly.

789 To consider planning application 2016/1231 Lilac Cottage, Wymondham Road - Conservatory to front elevation - Following discussion, Councillors had no objections to this planning application.
