



Concern for the Church building

Last summer I reported that there was concern about the condition of areas of the roof, and on a recent visit by the architect he also expressed concern about the plaster falling off the walls and the need to investigate the cause of the damp which he thinks is creating this problem.

There is going to be a need to fund raise, research grants and obtain donations, along with some possible opportunity for self-help with the investigation into the damp.



Patrick Maidment

The funeral of Patrick Maidment was held on 17th March at 3pm at All Saints, Wreningham.

Patrick and Jill Maidment came to Wreningham in 1986 where they brought up their 3 children and became full members of the community. Patrick was active in the Wreningham Social Club, enjoyed the Ceilidhs that were held in the Village Hall and on a number occasions brought his Morris Dancers to the village to entertain. His interest in flags was responsible for the idea of flying a flag from Wreningham church tower and he supplied these himself, changing them to fit the occasion. He was also one of the first members of the bell ringing group which was started up a few years ago and he had the idea of ringing on Christmas morning regardless of there being a Church service or not. He enjoyed open water swimming, was a coastal life guard and an enthusiastic observer of the stars and night sky.

A popular man, who was honoured by over 150 mourners at his funeral; friends from his different hobbies and interests, as well as local friends.
