KITCHEN CAPERS A Christmas Quickie

If you run out of time or have unexpected guests this is a delicious sweet which has few ingredients and takes no time at all to prepare.

(Serves 4)

 $\frac{1}{2}$ pt. double cream

3 level tbsp. honey

2 tbsp. brandy or whisky

3 oz. flaked almonds, toasted (not essential)

Gently whip cream until it forms soft peaks. Add honey a tablespoon at a time, whipping gently between each addition. Add 1 tablespoon brandy or whisky and whip again, then add the second tablespoon of spirit and whip again. The mixture should be thick and creamy but not stiff. Stir in 2 oz. toasted almonds and divide mixture between 4 glasses. Chill for at least 30 minutes in fridge and decorate with remaining almonds before serving.

(If you have no nuts available finely chopped crystallised ginger or glace fruits could be used or it can be left plain)
