#### Back by popular demand!!



#### Oil Purchase Scheme

The pilot trial for the Wreningham Oil Purchase Scheme was successfully completed earlier this month and several homes in the village benefitted from a discounted heating oil price. It is planned that the village will make an order every three months, with the next one being placed on **December 1**<sup>st</sup> **2010**.

The scheme works by combining our heating oil orders together, then asking the local oil companies for their best price in consideration of the bulk purchase. The larger the combined quantity ordered the higher the discount, with each home receiving the same discount. So the more people that get involved the more money each home will save. To make an order contact Geraint Harris prior to the dates published, giving your name, address with postcode, telephone number and the quantity of oil required. This information will then be passed to the heating oil company and each home will be contacted by the oil company to arrange payment and to inform them of the expected delivery date.

As a reminder, the next purchase date will be posted in the Mardle, on the website and on the village notice board. The closing dates for orders will be 5pm on December 1<sup>st</sup> 2010, March 1<sup>st</sup> 2011, June 1<sup>st</sup> 2011 and September 1<sup>st</sup> 2011. To place an order please contact:

#### WRENINGHAM FUEL TRUST

The Trust Deed sets out that "The income from Wreningham Fuel Trust has to be given in providing fuel for the poor persons of the parish of Wreningham". This means that the charity income is available to anybody in the parish who is in need and the application may be made by the needy person or anybody who wishes to nominate a person to receive help towards their fuel bills. It is a requirement of the Trust Deed that all the money received in the year is paid out in the same year. Traditionally, in the event of few applications, the Trust invites persons over the age of 70 years to apply to the fund.

We are now inviting applications for a distribution to take place in January.
