KITCHEN CAPERS

The most popular "cake" in my household at the moment (and with the lads next door) is

Toffee Bars

4 oz. marg.

4 oz. brown sugar

1 egg yelk

2 oz. plain flour

2 oz. porridge oats

Topping

3 oz. plain chocolate

1 oz. butter

chopped walnuts (optional)

Grease and line a swiss roll tin. Set oven to 375°F. Beat butter, sugar and egg yolk until smooth. Add flour and cats. Press mixture into tin and bake 15 - 20 minutes. Cool slightly. Melt butter and chocolate and spread over mixture in the tin. Cover with chopped walnuts. Cut into bars while warm, but leave in tin until completely cold.
