WRENINGHAM FOOTBALL CLUB

The club has made good progress following last season's promotion back to Division 4 of the Norwich and District Sunday League. Despite making an inconspicuous start, when only five points were obtained from the first seven fixtures, Wreningham are currently occupying fifth place in the table.

Injuries, unavailability and suspensions have caused numerous problems with team selections during the campaign. A particular loss has been last season's leading goal scorer Neil Rifis, who decided to commit himself to Saturday football with Newton Flotman and who to date has made just one appearance. Former players Alan Browne and John Turner returned to the club but again have only made isolated appearances due to work commitments. Richard Rix, Keith Howlett, Brian Burrett and Michael Lincoln have all suffered long-term injuries and added to team selection problems.

On the positive side, goalkeeper Graham Baldy, since joining the club in November, has added much needed stability to the team. Alongside loyal servant Stuart Cooper, who must be in contention for Player of the Year, the defence has looked a lot more secure than last season.

Richard Lincoln has taken on the role of senior striker in the absence of Rafis with relish, and his success is reflected in his seventeen goal tally this season.

Improvement has been most apparent in matches against the top teams. The 3 - 2 win in Pulham comes to mind when the South Norfolk side were top of the table. Draws at Carrow Road Finalists Salhouse and at home to Hethersett were on contrast to last season's results when we were well beaten by these two sides.

On the social front, approximately £250 was raised at the "Race Night" held in the village hall recently. Thanks to all those people who helped to make this evening so enjoyable and profitable.

KITCHEN CAPERS

The following recipe is for the sweet-toothed only!

Picnic Slices

8 oz. plain or milk cooking chocolate

2 oz. butter or margarine

4 oz. caster sugar 1 beaten egg

- oz. dessicated coconut

2 cz. sultanas

2 oz. glace cherries

Grease a Swiss Roll tin. Set oven to 300°F. Ereak chocolate into pieces and place in bowl over hot water. When melted, pour into bottom of Swiss Roll tin and leave to set. Cream fat and sugar, add egg, coconut, sultanas and chopped cherries. Mix well and spread evenly over chocolate. Bake for 30 minutes until golden brown. Leave to cool then cut into slices with a sharp knife.
