#### CRICKET REPORT

With just one match to play at the time of writing, it appears that the Cricket Club are vying for a top four position in the Burgess Shield. A good start to the season consolidated the team's position by remaining unbeaten in the league until late June. Holidays and work commitments usually mean the club cannot field their strongest side in late July and August but they bounced back to win against Hales, Hethersett and Ashwellthorpe in the autumn. The record of 8 wins, 3 draws and 6 defeats was a fair reflection on the teams form this season in the Shield and they did comfortably beat the likely winners, Swardeston.

Despite not managing a century for the team this year it appears that Kevin Ready will top the batting averages, and with John Eagling, Stephen Richardson, Brian Burrett, Richard Fairman and Graham Robbie all consistantly in the runs the team did show their batting strength. Once again Adge Browne proved a useful all rounder and captained the side well. Richard Rix, Richard Fairman, Brian Burrett, Kevin Ready and Steven Eagling were the mainstays of the bowling department but were well supported by Kevin Maddams, David Coleman and Mike McGregor. John Bruton and Barney Howes both kept wicket well and supported the batting.

Once again friendly matches were used to broaden the player base of the club and village stalwarts Charles Mattams and David Minns both performed well against touring side Cokenach.

Unfortunately, Wreningham failed to retain the Inter-village title, losing to newcomers and eventual winners Mulbarton.

During February 1994 a hoard of Roman coins was discovered in a field in Wreningham. This comprised 186 silver denarii which had been buried in a pot or jug some 1800 years ago.
