

I am in need of help with deliveries in the Mill Lane area, if anybody would be willing to take this on I would be pleased to hear from them.


A pay telephone has been installed in the village hall as it is felt that in an emergency there should be some way of contacting help rather than relying on people with mobile and car phones.


On behalf of the committee I would like to wish everybody a very Happy Christmas and a Healthy and Prosperous 1996.

If you find that you are not on the collection route, but would like to donate your paper please let us know:


