


### What are we telling you about?

Norfolk County Council are waymarking a 17-mile walking route between Norwich and Wymondham, following the historic route of Kett's Country. It will take in many villages on the way and will include five new circular walks, also following public rights of way and quiet roads.

There will be improvements to access, with the removal of stiles and repair of broken bridges. A bridge will be replaced and 50m of boardwalk will be installed along Wreningham FP3.

### Where is this happening?

This work will be happening on Wreningham FP3, to the eastern side of Long's Wood. A map of the route can be found overleaf.



### When is this work starting?

The work will be starting on Monday 4 October 2021 and will take approximately a month.

### What will we be doing?

A contractor will be replacing the ligger bridge at the northern end of Wreningham FP3 and cutting back the overgrown vegetation on the footpath. They will then be installing 50m of boardwalk over a stretch of the footpath which impassable in wet weather.

The footpath will be closed for the duration of the works.

### Why are we doing this work?

This project will improve access along the route, allowing people to enjoy a greater amount of Norfolk's countryside.

### How will this benefit you?

You will be able to enjoy this trail, safe in the knowledge that the condition of the route will be kept to a very high standard.


