# Wreningham Parish Council

We had an excellent Annual Parish Meeting in which various village groups spoke of their work in the past year and outlined what the coming year may hold in store. The APM minutes will be posted on the Wreningham website. The WPC meeting followed and confirmed Michael Hill as chair for the 2022/3 session. We also welcomed Andrea Tancred to our ranks as a new councillor and wish her well in her new role.

As one joins us another one leaves. Nicky Allen, our Clerk, has obtained full-time employment and has resigned due to time constraints. We are sorry to see her go and must look to secure another Clerk for our next meeting in July.

SNC District Councillor, Nigel Legg, reported to our meeting that some £3 (or 4?) million is reserved by the council for a new doctors' surgery in Hethersett. So, in two or three years, once built, this may provide new premises for the Humbleyard practice. Decisions have yet to be made around the continued use of the existing surgery premises, such as Mulbarton.

We were upset to discover that the bus stop near the Bird in Hand had been vandalised. The wooden bench had been ripped apart and left lying in pieces. Many thanks to Jon Moon who has undertaken to repair the damage for us.

The Village Litter pick, organised by Keith Morris, was completed on Sunday 15th May (see report elsewhere). The bar was open plus coffee and cakes. Our thanks to all – pickers, bakers, John on the bar, and those villagers who have picked up litter on their walks and/or taken it home!

#### Vacancy - Parish Council Clerk / Responsible Finance Officer (RFO)

A vacancy will exist from early June 2022 for a Parish Clerk which includes the role of RFO. This is an important position for the Council and for the Village. Although part-time (4.2 hours per week) this role enables the Parish Council to meet its legal and financial obligations (as RFO). It supports the Councillors in their work for, and on behalf of, the parishioners of Wreningham.

This is a home-based position. It is hourly paid based on a nationally agreed scale. The amount depends on the candidate's past experience, training and qualifications. The Council will support such training as is required.

The applicant will: \* be self-motivated and organised, \* have relevant experience in the use of Information Technology (supplied by the Council), \* work closely with the Chair of the Council, \* have, or will be expected to obtain, the Certificate in Local Council Administration (CiLCA).

To help understand, we place a quarterly order in January, April, July and October and my role is to collate all requirements each time and then go out to the different suppliers and try to achieve the best possible rates at that time. It goes without saying, the higher the volume, the better the price so if you do become part of the scheme, it will really help if you can work to the above periods and order through the syndicate rather than individually.

I then place the order and inform you who is supplying and the price achieved at that specific time. I play no part in either the payment or delivery side. This is picked up by the suppliers and they make direct contact with you regarding the actual delivery dates and the payment and will normally invoice you at the time of delivery.

If you would like to be included, please could you forward to me your full details including your name, full postal address, mobile contact number (one that the driver may need to call on the day of delivery) and any specific delivery instructions relating to your property etc and I will gladly add you to the list when I send out the invitation to order.
