We have had a visit from members of the DAC (Diocesan Advisory Committee – who are responsible for allowing repairs and alterations to churches). Their visit was to see the sorry stage of the floor under the choir seats and advise us on how we can go about removing these seats and creating an open space in the Chancel. The next job is to cost the project and then make formal application for removal of the seating (in this area only) and the wooden floor then replacing the flooring to match the rest of in that area.

#### **Recycling News**

Thanks to your dedicated recycling, our total raised so far is £780. I'm still hoping to reach £1,000 by the end of the year but it takes a lot of items to raise the money so keep going! As you know, we continue to support other fund raisers with their programmes including bread bags, blister packs and Pringles tubes. I can also now take **Babybel** packaging too – all of it from the net to the wax! How they're recycled is beyond me but that's their problem.

A quick reminder of our 8 programmes that raise funds for PACT (don't give them to supermarkets please):

1) KP snacks, nuts, popcorn, crisps and pretzels 2) Confectionery 3) Lavazza Eco Coffee Caps 4) Pladis biscuits & snacks 5) Toothpaste tubes and toothbrushes 6) Cheese packaging 7) Hygiene Home – dishwasher tablet pouches, dishwasher salt, packaging from cleaning wipes 8) Coffee bags (ground, instant or beans)

Thank you for sorting your donations into the separate programmes, flattening anything you can (especially crisp packets) and making sure they are free from contents. It makes my job so much easier if I just have to give a cursory glance rather than unscrewing, flattening and shaking each and every crisp packet or biscuit wrapper to read what they are!

Thank you also for taking your other flexible plastic to supermarkets rather than dropping it with me. Tesco Harford Bridge or Morrisons Wymondham have the largest cages outside the store for....

carrier bags, frozen food bags, fruit, vegetable and salad bags, delivery bags, cereal liners or plastic bags from muesli/granola, toilet roll wrapping, multi-pack wrapping, pasta, rice and other dry food bags including tea bag packaging, baby and pet food pouches, bubble wrap and cling film, plastic film lids, baby wipe packaging, sauce pouches, bags from dried fruit and nuts, greetings cards plastic film, compost bags

**HELP:** I'm always in need of large boxes – ideally approx. 60cm x 60cm x 50cm. If you ever get any of these, please let me have them. If anyone is going into Norwich, could you please take a bag of blister packs to Superdrug (St Stephens) as I'm struggling to keep up with the quantity being dropped off!!
