# A11 Spooner Row to Tuttles Interchange reconstruction scheme – Southbound Stage 3 repair work

I'm writing to let you know that we're planning to close the A11 southbound between Thickthorn and Attleborough, on the evening of 30 October 2022, and 6 November 2022.

The closures will take place between 8pm and 6am to allow us to complete repair work to the southbound carriageway, so it can remain safe and serviceable for road users.

Doing this work overnight when traffic is lighter means our teams can work in the safest way possible and avoids disruption on this stretch of the A11 during the day. We'll do our best to complete the work as quickly as possible, however all dates are subject to change due to operational requirements.

This activity at times may be noisy, and we'd like to apologise in advance for any disturbance caused. We'll instruct our teams to do their best to keep any disruption down to a minimum.

During this time, traffic wishing to travel southbound on the A11 will be diverted along the A47, before travelling south on the A140, and then the A1066 towards Thetford, before re-joining the A11. You can find a map of the diversion route at the end of this letter.

All dates are subject to change due to operational requirements.

### Keeping the community updated

We've sent a letter discussing the above to every home within a 500m of the scheme, so we can ensure that the local communities who will be impacted by our activity have been informed. We've also provided them with a 24/7 telephone number and email address for the project, so they can get in contact if required.
