A11 Spooner Row to Tuttles Interchange reconstruction scheme – Northbound road closures

I'm writing to let you know that we're planning to close the A11 road northbound between Attleborough and Tuttles, overnight on the evenings of 11,12 and 13 November 2022 inclusive.

The road closures will take place between 8pm and 6am to allow us to complete essential drainage work.

Doing this work overnight when traffic is lighter means that our teams can work in the safest way possible and avoids disruption to this stretch of the A11 during the day. We'll do our best to complete the work as quickly as possible, however all dates are subject to change due to operational requirements.

This activity at times may be noisy, and we'd like to apologise in advance for any disturbance caused. We'll instruct our teams to do their best to keep any disruption down to a minimum.

During this time, traffic wishing to travel northbound on the A11 will be diverted along the A1066 at Thetford, before travelling eastbound on the A140, and then northbound towards the A47. At the A47 junction join the A47 westbound to Thickthorn interchange. You can find a map of the diversion route at the end of this letter.

All dates are subject to change due to weather or operational requirements.

Keeping the community updated

We've sent a letter discussing the above to every home within a 500m of the scheme, so we can ensure that the local communities who will be impacted by our activity have been informed. We've also provided them with a 24/7 telephone number and email address for the project, so they can get in contact if required.
