We just want to say a big "thank you" to Val who has put in a huge amount of time and effort to produce the Mardle over many years.



Wreningham Parish Council

Luke McDaid was co-opted onto the Parish Council during the January meeting. We welcome him as our latest, and youngest councillor and wish him well in what we hope is to be a long career working with us for the benefit of the village.

As mentioned in the last Mardle, an exciting opportunity has arisen in the village to develop a parcel of land off Hethel Road for a community woodland or wildlife type project in conjunction with 2 or 3 houses.

Julian Wells' company, FW Properties, has been in contact with the Parish Council regarding the field behind the 10 house Church road development– *see map below*.



Essentially, they are asking if we, the Wreningham Community and the Parish Council, would support a development of 2 or 3 houses on Hethel Road in return for making the remaining land over to the village. The Company is offering to undertake site preparation and improvement prior to it changing hands. Also, we have discussed with them about providing financial support for the short to medium term in order to tackle land management, improvement and planting of trees and shrubs.

Recycling News

Happy New Year everyone. I hope you all had a great Christmas.

Following on from previous postings, whilst we didn't quite reach our goal of £1000 by the end of 2022, our total raised is now a fantastic £920. Thank you everyone; as soon as my bins are empty, they magically fill up again! I aim to send a consignment every month and this is no different. January saw 23kg of crisp & snack packaging and 5kg of biscuit & cake wrappers on their way to TerraCycle.

Good news! We've been accepted on the Carex handwash programme so please let me have all your empty refill pouches from Carex and any other brands together with any brand of hand wash pump.

We now have 8 programmes raising funds for our charity – crisps, biscuits, coffee, confectionery, cheese, home cleaning, Eco coffee pods and hand wash. I'm also on the waiting list for the toothpaste tubes & toothbrush programme so keep them coming.

As you know, we also collect for others collecting for their charities – bread bags, Pringles tubes and Warburtons waxed paper bread wrapping for Hallswood – and other items that don't raise funds but are kept from landfill by our efforts – contact lens packaging and blister packs. Every little helps!

How is everyone getting on with the bin collection app? If you have a smart phone, Search Bin Collections South Norfolk on the App Store or Google Play to download or <u>southnorfolkandbroadland.gov.uk/sncbinapp</u>. There have been a few teething problems but hopefully it's all sorted now.

Another useful app is Olio where you can pass on anything you don't want – including food and drink – or take anything that's being offered. Check it out.

Parish Council continued -An Opportunity

Adjacent to this land, there is a footpath crossing from Church Road to Hethel Road which was known as "Farthing Lane" and dates from the 1600s (thanks to David Kirk and the Wreningham Heritage Group for that fact). It is hoped that this will inspire a name for the parcel of land in a project which will involve the whole village. This is an exciting prospect and will provide us with the opportunity to build a new wildlife and natural asset to be enjoyed for many years ahead.

The first thing we need to do is to arrange a meeting to explore the support for this proposal and to consider what might be done with this land. We will announce this on the village website (wreningham.org.uk) in the near future. The FW Properties planning application will require evidenced and wide support from us. So, there are many things to think about: a new development, legal matters, finance, its name, use, design, our involvement, its management, areas for nature and for people, placement of paths and fences, etc., etc.

We wish this to be a community-wide project and an asset for us all. Please think about ways in which you may be able to help make it happen.

Other Matters - Benches around the village

We would like to install 3 or 4 benches around the village to offer a chance to sit and chat or just take in the view. We'd be pleased to receive your suggestions for suitable public sites. Naturally, we will need to discuss these with the landowners, but we hope to get this done before the end of Summer.

Just to remind you that some topics never go away and need your consideration:

- Trimming roadside hedges
- Maintaining water courses to reduce flooding risk
- Litter picking (when out on a walk?)
- Parking with consideration for others
- Slow you down, less than 30mph throughout the village, please

Thorpe Hall, the new village hall in Ashwellthorpe, is open each Tuesday 10 am - 2 pm offering warm drinks, soup, toys for children, a copy of the EDP and a chance to chat. All free and open to members of all our parishes.

Tacolneston village hall – also open each Tuesday 11 - 3 pm free drinks and a light lunch in a warm venue and a chance to chat. Stay as long as you wish. Again open to all our villages.

The church do not have enough manpower to put on our own event, but on the last Wednesday of the month (22^{nd} Feb & 29^{th} March) there is a coffee morning 10 - 12 run by Jean and the village community at Wreningham village hall. The church will follow that at 12.30 with a light lunch which is free to anybody who books it in advance. Call 01508 488123 to reserve food.
