Wreningham Parish Council now has its full complement of 7 councillors. We welcome Ben Jarvis to the Council. He was co-opted at the last meeting and has expressed his interest in looking after the concerns of the Top Row area.

The Farthings – A Background Summary

The Farthings is a plan to make use of about 5 acres of fallow field in Hethel Road, which is owned by FW Properties, to create a community area (e.g. trees, meadows, pond, wetland, footpaths, etc.) for Wreningham. The larger part, around 4 acres, is proposed to be gifted to Wreningham Parish Council specifically for the purpose and FW Properties would fund all the costs for 10-15 years.

The remaining 1½ acres of the field would be sold by FW Properties with outline planning consent to create 3 plots for self-build housing. All of this would require upfront approval from the District Council planning department; hence, the two aspects would either stand or fall together - it is an all or nothing scheme.

The Farthings Meeting on 27th June

The meeting on the 27th June was attended by some 70 parishioners. They heard about the field's history, the proposal by FW Properties Ltd, practical environmental development issues and the availability of local district support.

A further 20 emailed to say that although they could not attend, they'd appreciate further information. An update is included in this Mardle on page 12.

A summary and relevant documentation will be placed on the Wreningham Website – keep an eye out for the information being posted.

Footpath Help



The recent weather has been very conducive to rampant growth — especially for grass. This has meant that our footpaths are outpacing any attempts to keep them clear and accessible. This is a pity as so many parishioners enjoy the footpaths and a number take their dogs too. We wondered if we could gather a group of volunteers to actively manage the footpaths. If we are offered access to suitable grass cutting machines then the occasional task would be quickly addressed. One other thought: taking a pair of secateurs with you can tackle the overgrowth by brambles and wayward branches.

Thanks to those who pick up items of litter strewn around the village. It is apparent that the amount of litter is reducing as folk help out with a little bit every time they go for a walk.

On Thurs 13 July we were joined in church by class one from Wreningham School for a family worship service followed by refreshments. It was lovely to see these little ones.

This year there are 58 children leaving the 4 Church Schools across the benefice and moving to senior school. We have presented each one with a bible and we wish them well in their new schools and the future.

The timing of church services has had to be changed starting from August. On the 4th Sunday there will be a BCP Holy Communion service at 9.30 a.m. at Wreningham and all other services will start at 11 a.m. for details of which church they are in, please see the notice board in the church porch.

The extracts showed us a young man capable of holding together three flourishing Farm businesses but prey at times to depressive thoughts. Photographs from our archive were used to illustrate David's talk and the whole was a fascinating glimpse into Wreningham history.

Our next meeting will be on September 8th at 2pm in the village hall and will be an open forum with historic village photographs on display. We hope these will act as an aide memoir for some members who have lived in Wreningham a long time and bring forth some interesting anecdotes. An Update

The 27th June meeting at the village hall concluded with the mood of the meeting in favour of progressing the "Farthings" project.

We now need volunteers to form a steering group for both pursuing a viable plan and, on the basis of sufficient agreement, guiding the way ahead. We need a high level of consensus within the community and with FW Properties so they can make a suitable submission to the District Council planners. Establishing this (or not!) will be the group's first objective.

Two (alternative) potential schemes have been drafted indicating how the overall area of the land might be organised. This is very much a "listening" time: the second draft scheme arose as a direct consequence of feedback during the 27th June meeting and you can shortly view both outlines on the Wreningham village website. Nothing is agreed; everything remains work-in-progress.

Whilst the Parish Council and FW Properties have initiated these discussions, the volunteers will need to identify their individual skills and form themselves into a group reporting to the Parish Council (for insurance and authority purposes) to take the lead role.

Anyone who wishes to come forward – individually or as a group, please drop an email to wren.farthings@gmail.com or contact a parish councillor. Without such a team, and without suitable consensus, there is unlikely to be a "Farthings" project.
