Wreningham Parish Council

Surface Water Flooding South Norfolk Council has a new role specifically dedicated to addressing surface water flooding, ditches and the like. I invited the new person to visit the village. With her boss, we spent the morning walking & looking over our set of problem areas, inspecting the ditches, thinking about where development has led to enclosed gullies and considering the risks for our residents and what might need to be done. Since then, the recent heavy rain has put a strain on the drainage systems around Wreningham. Fortunately, no-one has experienced a domestic flooding. Her advice? As a bare minimum, keep your ditches clear to allow water to flow freely.





The Farthings (Hethel Road)

An Update

I would like to thank Jean Agnew who identified that the path running from Church Road to Hethel Road has been known since the 17th Century as "Farthings Lane". Ordnance Survey (OS) has accepted the suggestion to update their maps to reflect this important piece of history – especially as it supplied the name for the community land we anticipate coming into our possession. Then we can then ensure "The Farthings" is also duly registered with OS, the Post Office, South Norfolk, et al.

FW Properties Ltd has taken onboard a wide range of comments, adjusted their plans, held discussions with South Norfolk planners and are nearly ready to issue their formal planning application. Expect that before the next Mardle is out. Everyone will then have the opportunity to express their views on this application. We consider this community land to have great potential for social and environmental benefit to the community, but there are a few steps yet to take. For instance we need to obtain an agreement about the funding to help create, maintain and improve The Farthings. We also need to agree with FW Properties what they have to do to prepare this area for community ownership and management.

Parish Council (continued)

Decorative Dog Poo There are those among us who delight us by leaving a trail of little black bags of dog poo by our footpaths and roadways. Thank you, but no thank you. Having done one part of the task, please finish it off by taking it home for disposal or use the bin provided by the playing field. To provide choice we will install a second bin.

Playground We recently walked the field and discussed the various observations and recommendations for action in the inspection report received earlier in the year. We have agreed a set of actions to address the few medium risk observations (there are no high risk). If you want to find out more – come to the next meeting for our report, or read the minutes on-line.

Roadside hedges Several people have contacted me to say that our village is looking unkempt as many of the hedgerows are overgrown and intruding into the road. Please think about maintaining your hedges so that road users are not inconvenienced. I know a few walkers take a pair of secateurs and snip off the wider bits – it's a start, but can you help them out?

Wymondham Road planning application We have received notice for comment for an intriguing planning application (see our website) to convert an agricultural shed into five residential dwellings. It was heralded by an announcement on the Devlin website that they had acquired Wreningham land (Donald Whiterod's farm buildings – 13 acres) for a few luxury homes.

Parish Council meeting Our next meeting is scheduled for 9th January 2024 in the Margaret Preston room starting at 7.30pm. We look forward to seeing you there.

The benefice plant sale and table top event held on a very wet Saturday in October raised over £500.00 towards church funds, as did the Harvest Supper held earlier in the month.

We meet 10:00 am – 12 noon in the Margaret Preston Room Sessions are £2 and include refreshments. Please make a note, we'd love to see you there.





Recycling News

Thank you to everyone who came to the Freesale and either had a table or a fuller bag when leaving. Whilst we raised £30 for charity in donations, it's true to say that the attendance was disappointing and I really don't know why. If anyone has any suggestions how we could get a really buzzing, busy event going, I'm all ears.

We're coming up to that festive period when lots is bought, wrapping goes wild and recycling takes second place. There are, however, many ways to celebrate Christmas and all that entails whilst still thinking of the planet. One way is in the gifts you give. Instead of more stuff, how about a gift of a memory or activity? When wrapping gifts, remember that paper that bears glitter can't be recycled so choose carefully. All that wrapping ribbon is not recyclable and can be dangerous to wildlife if it gets out. Decorative string can be composted, paper with double sided tape and no ribbon can be recycled or a gift bag re-used. Cards that bear glitter also can't be recycled although the industry seems to be improving. Re-use decorations, rent a living tree which goes back after Christmas or buy a live one that can go in the garden afterwards. All these initiatives support the environment.

Update on blister packs Your household can now register with TerraCycle and send your blister packs to them. Go to https://www.terracycle.com/en-GB/brigades/aldi-uk, set up an account for your household, request a label which you then download from the email you receive, print it out, attach it to an A4 envelope and send up to 30 blister packs (free) to TerraCycle. Your household can do this twice a month, so 60 blister packs per month. This should meet most needs. It probably exceeds most household's needs so please, if you don't need 2 labels a month, ask for them both and forward the label you don't want to me (email below) and I can reduce the mountain of blister packs in my garage. If you don't need to recycle ANY blister packs, can I ask that you request 2 labels anyway and send them both the me. Every month until the mountain has gone down! Other news. The confectionery programme is stopping so please don't give me your chocolate wrappers etc, they can be recycled at supermarkets with other flexible plastic. All other programmes continue.
